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# Budgets

**Budget:** An approximation of expenses that will be incurred during a set period and, as in this case, for a specific project.

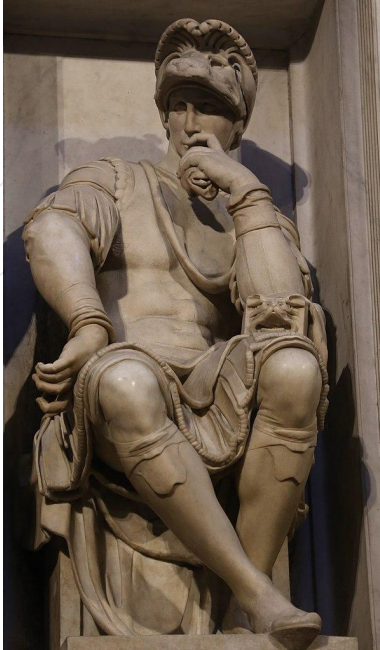
# Thinking about the Budget



- From the beginning
- Think about what things, like staffing, consultants, equipment costs
- Budget outlines the money you need to carry out your proposed project
- Need a firm grasp of narrative, goals, objectives, and outcomes

# Thinking about the Budget



- Need to be versed in the necessary steps to achieve goals
- Budget lays out what each step will cost
  - Staff salary and fringe benefits (two separate lines)
  - Equipment
  - External consultants
  - Travel
  - Training

## Goal!

Convey a realistic understanding of the costs to see your project through successfully

# Where The Budget Comes From

- From the activities you are proposing
- Numbers need to be **realistic**
- Numbers need to reflect what you **actually require** to implement the project
- Budget needs to be **Comprehensive** and **Detailed**

# Two Key Questions\*

1

**Am I asking for enough?**

Is the money enough to achieve the objectives proposed?

2

**Is the amount reasonable, outlandish, or in between?**

Are you asking for too much or not enough?



**Goldilocks of Asks!**

Not too High, Not too Low, **Just Right!**

# How do I Get Accurate Numbers?



**Do Not Guess or Rely on Memory**

# The Line-Item Budget

Read the detailed application instructions carefully

Know the Award Amount - for CLIR Hidden Collections = \$50,000-\$300,000

Know the **Allowable Costs**, those are the budget line items

Staff Salaries  
Fringe Benefits (A percentage of the annual salary)

Staff Training  
Consultant Fees

Allowable Costs but with Restrictions, Limitations, Parameters

Needs to be **Detailed** and **Specific**



# The Budget Narrative

Explains Each Line Item

Explains how you arrived at the costs

Explains how it relates/helps you reach your stated goals

Explain how each expense connects to the objectives

Explain how the money will help you complete activities, meet objectives, reach outcomes

Explain how and why you came up the numbers for each line item



# The Budget Narrative

## What to Include

What are you paying for?

How much per item?

How much per hour or per day?


**Who** are you paying?

How many hours per week will each person charge?  
How many days for a consultant?

How did you arrive at these dollar amounts?

Don't Forget to include In-Kind Donations





# What the Budget Shows\*

1

**You can meet program needs**

Staffing, and other costs

2

**Activities can be done properly**

Money you are asking for is enough

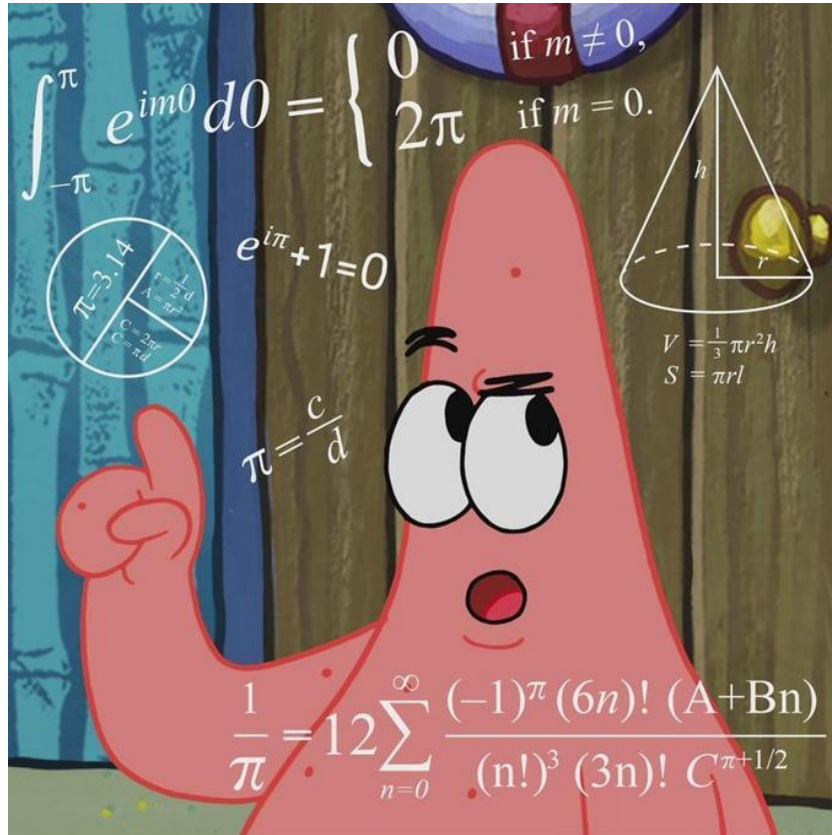

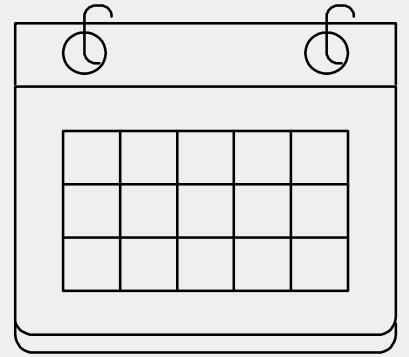
