

What is Omeka?

Omeka is a free, open source web-publishing platform for the display of library, museums, and archival collections. Its strengths are its flexible and easy to use tools for creating online exhibits and working with user contributions of objects and metadata. Developers at the Rosenzweig Center for History and New Media at George Mason University created Omeka with scholars without large IT departments in mind.

What is the Curator Dashboard?

Building on our experience working with Omeka and the Grateful Dead Archive Online, the UC Santa Cruz Library is developing a suite of plugins to allow easy import of Web 2.0 objects, such as images and video. We're streamlining batch metadata creation and editing, and developing item/collection reporting and management tools. For the full list of all 14 plugins, see our project website:

Easily import images and their associated metadata from Flickr Choose individual images or entire streams



YouTubeImport

Import YouTube videos and their associated metadata Videos are embedded directly into the item record



HistoryLog

Track curatorial actions: item creation, metadata edits, etc. Displays the history directly in the item record admin view



METSExport

Export Omeka items as standardized METS objects



BulkMetadataEditor

Edit your metadata in bulk! Find and replace based on collection, existing item metadata, and more


